1. There's only one sentence in the title of the manuscript.		
2. The title must be a declarative sentence. There are no final marks on the title of the manuscript, for example: question marks "? "		
3. The title of the manuscript should be no less than 7 words and no more than 25 words.		
4. Capitalizes only the first letter in each word of the title, except the appropriate function words or nouns.		
For example: <u>N</u> urture in <u>T</u> echnological <u>I</u> nnovation		
Author's Name	√	×
1. The author's name is written in full.		
2. Authors' titles are. example:–Dr. Prof.		
3. Please write down the full names of the authors. There should not be only one word in the author's name. If the names of the authors are special, let us know (especially for capital and small print, or círio between the names).		
4. There should be no círio in the name of an author. For example: A., Wilson (The comma will be deleted.)		
5. Must be a period in the abbreviated form of the name. For example: <u>A.</u> Wilson		
For example: Levon Wilson ¹ , Silva Wilson ^{2,*}

1. Author affiliation must include department/faculty,		



university/institute, city, and nation. (There should be NO PO Box, zip code, telephone, fax or road in tele affiliation of the author.)		
2. The author's affiliation must be written in English.		
3. The author's affiliation should not be in abbreviated form.

1. The email address must be available.		
2. Check and confirm the authors and the corresponding email address.		
3. Only one email address should be attached to an author.		
4. There is a corresponding author in the manuscript, he or she must provide your email address. (It should be only a corresponding author .)

1. The abstract should have no less than 200 words and no more than 500 words.		
2. The abstract must be in a single paragraph.		
<p>for instance:</p> <p>Abstract</p> <p>The abstract is an independent essay that introduces the theme of the manuscript. Usually includes the research objective, the research method, the analysis of the research, the results of the research, the conclusion of the research, etc. An excellent abstract should highlight the innovative results of the research, have clear inclusion, avoid the repetition of content and give the full name of the abbreviations the first time, which makes the manuscript</p>		



easy to be understood. (The abstract should be between 200 and 400 words)

1. Must be at least 3 words and a maximum of 8. Separated by point.		
For example: Monetary Policy. Dhaka Stock Exchange (DSE). Return on Shares		
Main Body of the Manuscript	√	×
1. To meet the standard of our publications it must be divided into at least three parts. for instance: 1.Introduction 2.XXXXX (the detailed content of the paper) 3. Methodology 4. Results 5. Conclusion 6. Acknowledgements (if any)		
2. Add the numbers from the first part of the manuscript. The first part should be numbered as "1. Introduction."		
3. The number of titles must be successive.		
4. The number of captions under the same part should not be less than two. Just like, there must be at least two subtitles 2.1, 2.2 under title 2; there must be at least two subtitles 2.1.1, 2.1.2 in legend 2.1.		
5. There are fourth level titles, please number the titles with Roman numerals "i, ii, iii..." (do not use 1.2.1.1, 1.2.1.2, 1.2.1.3...); If there are titles under the fourth level title, please number the titles with English letter "a, b, c..." (no use 1.2.1.1, 1.2.1.2, 1.2.1.3...)		
for instance: 1. Introduction 2. Theoretical background

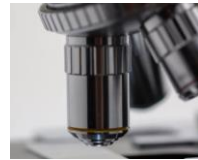

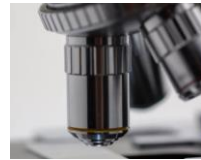

2. Figures must be numbered consecutively throughout the manuscript using the single number system. Such as: Figure 1, figure 2, figure 3...		
3. The numbers must be standardized. Such as: Figure 1, Figure 2, Figure 3... (Do not use Fig. 1, Fig. 2, Fig. 3...)		
4. The content of the figures should be clear.		
5. All words in the figures must be written in English.

2. Formula numbers must be out of the formula and editable.		
3. If there are formulas being created by Math Type in the manuscript, please offer the name of the software that the author used to edit the formulas.		
4. There's confusing code in the formulas.

1. There must be at least 10 references.		
2. Check and confirm that the references and the number		



of references are correct.		
3. References must be numbered and marked in the corresponding position of the main body in the form of [] (such as: [1], [2], [3] ...).		
4. There should be no blank semashes in the contents of the references. If there is any blank content, mark it in the manuscript. If not, please also delete the blank part. For example: _____ (2013), "Internal information technology audit process". The lines in the reference should be revised.		
for instance: [1] Paul XXXXX,Michael XXXXX. Environmental Migrants from the Coastal Area: a study of perception of the Moham-madpur Slums. <i>International Journal of Sensors and Sensor Networks</i> . Vol. 3, No. 1, 2015, pp. 1-11.

1. Words in the manuscript should not be linked. For example: <u>Identifiable admin practices among employees.</u>		
2. There must be no words hidden in the manuscript. Such as: lv.6 - drying of treated okra.		
3. There should be no comment on the manuscript. If there are comments, please check and review them according to the comment, then delete the comments. for instance: 		
4. The manuscript part, such as Recognitions, Conflict of Interest, References, etc. following the part of the conclusion does not need to be numbered. If it's numbered, let's delete it. for instance: 5.Concussion		



6. Acknowledgements References		
5. Parts that do not meet the journal's standard will be excluded in the final manuscript. Such as: theheader, the part of "To Quote This Article".		
6. Footnotes should be brief and concise to facilitate diagramming work.
